Common Wound Care Questions

So you have had Mohs Micrographic Surgery and now it is time to care for the wound. When the surgery is over you are told to begin wound care in 24 or 48 hours after the surgery depending on the type of wound repair performed.

Wound care consists of:

- 1) Washing the surgical site with a mild soap, such as Dove or Dial, mixed in luke warm water.
- 2) Applying Vaseline and a non-stick gauze and securing it with tape.

A common question that patients ask is why we recommend Vaseline instead of Neosporin, Polysporin, Bacitracin, or Aquaphor.

Dr. Carruth prefers Vaseline because it is a non-irritating product. Neosporin and other antibiotic ointments will keep the surgical site moist, but studies have shown that they can also lead to an allergic reaction in approximately 10% of patients who use them.

Vaseline not only keeps the surgical site clean, but also provides a barrier layer that keeps the surgical site covered. This means that Vaseline helps keep germs out and decreases the risk of infection. It also keeps the site hydrated and improves the healing process. Studies have shown there is no difference in infection rates between Vaseline and Bacitracin applied to surgical wounds.

Another question people often ask is: Is it okay to leave surgical site open to the air?

The answer is No. Leaving the surgical site open to the air so that it can "breathe" is a mistake because wound care studies have shown that wounds heal 40% faster in a moist healing environment.

Our goal is to help you heal as quickly as possible with the best cosmetic outcome so we strongly encourage you to follow the wound care instructions we give you.
