Mohs Micrographic Surgery is an advanced treatment procedure for skin cancer which offers the highest potential for recovery. Mohs procedures usually take about 2 to 4 hours. Some cancers require 2 to 4 stages for complete removal. During each stage, there will be a 45 minute to one hour break. During this time the Lab technician is processing your tissue and then the Mohs surgeon will meticulously examine the tissue for remaining cancer cells. Here is where you think, "One hour!?!
